



#### THE ACCLAMATION

The People standing, the Celebrant sings this



The Celebrant then continues

There is one Body and one Spirit;

People There is one hope in God's call to us;

Celebrant One Lord, one Faith, one Baptism;

People One God and Father of all.

People And with thy spirit.

Celebrant Let us pray.

The people kneel as the Celebrant prays the Collect of the Day.

#### DAY OF PENTECOST

Almighty God, who on this day didst open the way of eternal life to every race and nation by the promised gift of thy Holy Spirit: Shed abroad this gift throughout the world by the preaching of the Gospel, that it may reach to the ends of the earth; through Jesus Christ thy Son our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee, in the unity of the same Spirit, ever one God, world without end. **Amen.** 

#### THE LESSONS

The people sit. The liturgy continues with the appointed Lessons.

A Reading from the Act of the Apostles (2:1-11).

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of

fire, distributed and resting on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance. Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. And they were amazed and wondered, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Par'thians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopota'mia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phryg'ia and Pamphyl'ia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyre'ne, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians, we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God."

After the Reading, the Reader says

The Word of the Lord.

People Thanks be to God.

Psalm 104:24-31



- 24 O Lord, how manifold are thy / works! \* in wisdom hast thou made them all; the earth is full of thy / riches.
- 25 So is the great and wide sea / also; \* wherein are things creeping innumerable, both small and great / beasts.
- 26 There go the ships, and there is that le- / viathan, \*
  whom thou hast made to take his pastime there- / in.
- 27 These wait all upon / thee, \* that thou mayest give them meat in due / season.
- 28 When thou givest it them, they / gather it; \* and when thou openest thy hand, they are filled with / good.
- 29 When thou hidest thy face, they are / trou bled: \*
  when thou takest away their breath, they die, and are turned again to their / dust.

A Reading from the Second Epistle of St. Paul to the Corinthians (12:4-13).

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of working, but it is the same God who inspires them all in every one. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the ability to distinguish between spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are inspired by one and the same Spirit, who apportions to each one individually as he wills. For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free and all were made to drink of one Spirit.

After the Reading, the Reader says

The Word of the Lord.

People Thanks be to God.

The people stand.

Stanzas 1-2

The Deacon reads or chants the Gospel, first saying or singing

♣ The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. John (20:19-23).

People Glory be to thee, O Lord.

On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being shut where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

After the Gospel, the Celebrant or Deacon says or sings

The Gospel of the Lord.

People Praise be to thee, O Christ.

#### THE SERMON

Following the Sermon, the Candidates with their Sponsors stand before the Celebrant.

#### THE PRESENTATION

The Celebrant says

The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

#### ADULTS AND OLDER CHILDREN

The Candidates who are able to answer for themselves are presented individually by their Sponsors, using full names as follows

I present Jonathon Patrick Duffey to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

The Celebrant asks Candidates the following

Celebrant Have you already been baptized?

Candidate No.

Celebrant Do you desire to be baptized?

Candidate I do.

#### ADULTS SEEKING THE LAYING ON OF HANDS

The Bishop says

The candidate for Confirmation will now be presented.

The Candidate and Presenters stand facing the Bishop as their Presenters say

Presenters Reverend Father in God, we present this person to receive the laying on of hands.

Bishop Has she been adequately prepared? Presenter She has.

#### PROFESSION OF FAITH

The Bishop then examines the Candidates and the Godparents and Sponsoring Parents, saying

Question Do you renounce the devil and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Answer I renounce them.

Question Do you renounce the empty promises and deadly deceits of this world that corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Answer I renounce them.

Question Do you renounce the sinful desires of the flesh that draw you from the love of God?

Answer I renounce them.

The Bishop continues

Question Do you turn to Jesus Christ and confess him as your Lord and Savior?

Answer I do.

Question Do you joyfully receive the Christian Faith, as revealed in the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments?

Answer I do.

Question Will you obediently keep God's holy will and commandments, and walk in them all the days of your life?

Answer I will, the Lord being my helper.

The Bishop then addresses the Congregation, saying

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support *these persons* in *their* life in Christ?

The Congregation responds

We will.

The Bishop then says

Let us join with *these Candidates* to proclaim our faith in the words of the ancient baptismal confession, the Apostles' Creed.

Bishop Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

People I do.

I believe in God the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ his only Son

Bishop Do you believe and trust in Jesus Christ? People I do.

our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead.
He ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty.
From thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.

Bishop Do you believe and trust in the Holy Ghost?

People I do.

I believe in the Holy Ghost, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, № and the life everlasting. Amen.

#### PRAYER FOR THE CANDIDATE FOR HOLY BAPTISM

The Bishop now prays for the baptismal Candidates as follows Let us pray

Almighty and everlasting Father, in your great mercy you saved Noah and his family in the Ark from the destruction of the flood, prefiguring the Sacrament of Holy Baptism. Look mercifully upon these your servants. Wash and sanctify them through your Holy Spirit, that they may be delivered from destruction and received into the Ark of Christ's Church; and being steadfast in faith, joyful

through hope, and rooted in love, they may pass through the turbulent floods of this troublesome world and come into the land of everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.** 

#### THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

The font is to be filled with clean water immediately before the Thanksgiving over the Water.

Bishop The Lord be with you.

People And with thy spirit.

BishopLift up your hearts.

People We lift them up unto the Lord.

Bishop Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

People It is meet and right so to do.

The Bishop continues

We thank thee, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation; through it thou didst lead the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise, and in it thy Son Jesus received the baptism of John in the River Jordan when the Holy Spirit descended upon him as a dove. We thank thee, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are made regenerate by the Holy Ghost. Therefore in joyful obedience to thy Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in

the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.

Here the Bishop touches the water and says

Now, Father, sanctify this water by the power of thy Holy Spirit, and grant that all who are baptized here be cleansed from sin, be born again, and continue for ever faithful in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior; to whom, with thee, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, be all honor and glory, world without end. **Amen.** 

#### THE BAPTISM

The Bishop may say to the Sponsors Name this Candidate.

Then the Bishop immerses the Candidate or pours water upon the Candidate three times, saying

Jonathon, I baptize thee in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.** 

The Bishop makes the sign of the Cross upon the forehead of the newly haptized (and may use the Oil of Chrism to do so), saying

Jonathon, thou art sealed by the Holy Ghost in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen.** 

If garments or candles are presented, they are given here.

Heavenly Father, we thank thee that by water and the Holy Ghost thou hast bestowed upon these thy servants the forgiveness of sin, received them as thine own children by adoption, made them members of thy holy Church, and raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in thy Holy Spirit, that they may enjoy everlasting salvation through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.** 

The Celebrant continues

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

Celebrant and People

We receive you into the fellowship of the Church. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in the royal priesthood of all his people.

#### THE CONFIRMATION

The Bishop continues

Let us now pray for those who have made an adult profession of Faith and who seek the laying on of hands. Almighty and everliving God, we beseech you to strengthen these your servants for witness and ministry through the power of your Holy Spirit. Daily increase in them your manifold virtues of grace: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and true godliness, and the spirit of holy fear, now and for ever. Amen.

#### FOR CONFIRMATION

The Each confirmand kneels in front of the Bishop. The Bishop, then laying his hands upon the person's head, prays

Defend, O Lord, this your servant Nancy. with your heavenly grace, that she may continue yours for ever, and daily increase in your Holy Spirit more and more until she comes into the fullness of your everlasting kingdom.



Here a Proper Preface is sung.


#### PENTECOST

THE PRAYER OF CONSECRATION

The people kneel. The Bishop continues

All glory be to thee, Almighty God, our heavenly Father, for that thou, of thy tender mercy, didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ to suffer death upon the Cross for our redemption; who made there, by his one oblation of himself once offered, a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and satisfaction, for the sins of the whole world; and did institute, and in his Holy Gospel command us to

continue, a perpetual memory of that his precious death and sacrifice, until his coming again.

At the following words concerning the bread, the Celebrant is to hold it, or lay a hand upon it; and at the words concerning the cup, to hold or place a hand upon the cup and any other vessel containing wine to be consecrated.

For in the night in which he was betrayed, he took bread; and when he had given thanks, he brake it,\* and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Likewise, after supper, he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink ye all of this; for this is my Blood of the New Testament, which is shed for you and for many, for the remission of sins. Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me."

Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father, according to the institution of thy dearly beloved Son our Savior Jesus Christ, we, thy humble servants, do celebrate and make here before thy divine Majesty, with these thy holy gifts, the memorial thy Son hath commanded us to make; having in remembrance his blessed passion and precious death, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming again in glory.

[And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; most humbly beseeching thee to grant that, by the merits and death of thy Son Je-

sus Christ, and through faith in his Blood, we, and all thy whole Church, may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion.]

And here we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, ourselves, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy, and living sacrifice unto thee; humbly beseeching thee that we, and all others who shall be partakers of this Holy Communion, may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, be fil \* led with thy grace and heavenly benediction, and made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him

[And although we are unworthy, through our manifold sins, to offer unto thee any sacrifice, yet we beseech thee to accept this our bounden duty and service, not weighing our merits, but pardoning our offenses, through Jesus Christ our Lord;] By whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, all honor and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end.





We do not presume to come to this thy Table, O merciful Lord,


trusting in our own righteousness, but in thy manifold and great mercies.

Facing the people, the Celebrant sings or says the following Invitation
The Gifts of God for the People of God. 

✓ Or this

Behold the Lamb of God, behold him that taketh away the sins of the world. Blessed are they that are called to the marriage supper of the Lamb. 

JOHN 1:29, REVELATION 19:9

The ministers receive the Sacrament in both kinds, and then immediately deliver it to the People.

The Bread and Cup are given to the communicants with these words

The Body of our Lord Jesus Christ, [which was given for thee, preserve thy body and soul unto everlasting life. Take and eat this in remembrance that Christ died for thee, and feed on him in thy heart by faith, with thanksgiving.]

The Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, [which was shed for thee, preserve thy body and soul unto everlasting life. Drink this in remembrance that Christ's Blood was shed for thee, and be thankful.]

During the ministration of Communion, hymns, psalms, or anthems may be sung.

with the spiritual food of the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son our Savior Jesus Christ; and dost assure us thereby of thy favor and goodness towards us;


and that we are very members incorporate in the mystical body of thy Son, the blessed company of all faithful people; and are also heirs, through hope, of thy everlasting kingdom.


