A Reading from the Act of the Apostles (2:1-11).

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance. Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. And they were amazed and wondered, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Par'thians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopota'mia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phryg'ia and Pamphyl'ia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyre'ne, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians, we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God."

Psalm 104:24-31

- 24 O Lord, how manifold are thy works! * in wisdom hast thou made them all; the earth is full of thy riches.
- 25 So is the great and wide sea also; * wherein are things creeping innumerable, both small and great beasts.
- 26 There go the ships, and there is that leviathan, *
 whom thou hast made to take his pastime therein.
- 27 These wait all upon thee, *
 that thou mayest give them meat in due season.
- 28 When thou givest it them, they gather it; * and when thou openest thy hand, they are filled with good.
- 29 When thou hidest thy face, they are troubled: * when thou takest away their breath, they die, and are turned again to their dust.
- 30 When thou lettest thy breath go forth, they shall be made; * and thou shalt renew the face of the earth.
- 31 The glorious majesty of the Lord shall endure for ever; *
 the Lord shall rejoice in his works.

A Reading from the Second Epistle of St. Paul to the Corinthians (12:4-13).

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of working, but it is the same God who inspires them all in every one. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the ability to distinguish between spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are inspired by one and the same Spirit, who apportions to each one individually as he wills. For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and all were made to drink of one Spirit.
