A Reading from the Book of Exodus

(16:2-4, 9-15).

And the whole congregation of the people of Israel murmured against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness, and said to them, “Would that we had died by the hand of the Lord in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the fleshpots and ate bread to the full; for you have brought us out into this wilderness to kill this whole assembly with hunger.” Then the Lord said to Moses, “Behold, I will rain bread from heaven for you; and the people shall go out and gather a day’s portion every day, that I may prove them, whether they will walk in my law or not. And Moses said to Aaron, “Say to the whole congregation of the people of Israel, ‘Come near before the Lord, for he has heard your murmurings.’” And as Aaron spoke to the whole congregation of the people of Israel, they looked toward the wilderness, and behold, the glory of the Lord appeared in the cloud. And the Lord said to Moses, “I have heard the murmurings of the people of Israel; say to them, ‘At twilight you shall eat flesh, and in the morning you shall be filled with bread; then you shall know that I am the Lord your God.’ ” In the evening quails came up and covered the camp; and in the morning dew lay round about the camp. And when the dew had gone up, there was on the face of the wilderness a fine, flake-like thing, fine as hoarfrost on the ground. When the people of Israel saw it, they said to one another, “What is it?” For they did not know what it was. And Moses said to them, “It is the bread which the Lord has given you to eat.”

Psalm 78:14-26.

- 14 He divided the sea, and let them go through;*
he made the waters to stand on an heap.
- 15 In the daytime also he led them with a cloud,*
and all the night through with a light of fire.
- 16 He clave the hard rocks in the wilderness,*
and gave them drink thereof, as it had been
out of the great depth.
- 17 He brought waters out of the stony rock,*
so that it gushed out like the rivers.
- 18 Yet for all this they sinned more against him,*
and provoked the Most Highest in the wilder-
ness.
- 19 They tempted God in their hearts,*
and required meat for their lust.
- 20 They spake against God also, saying,*
Shall God prepare a table in the wilderness?
- 21 He smote the stony rock indeed, that the water
gushed out, and the streams flowed withal;*
but can he give bread also, or provide flesh for
his people?
- 22 When the LORD heard this, he was wroth;*
so the fire was kindled in Jacob, and there
came up heavy displeasure against Israel;
- 23 Because they believed not in God, *
and put not their trust in his help.
- 24 So he commanded the clouds above,*
and opened the doors of heaven.
- 25 He rained down manna also upon them for to
eat,*
and gave them food from heaven.

26 So man did eat angels' food;* for he sent them meat enough.

A Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Ephesians (4:1-16).

Now this I affirm and testify in the Lord, that you must no longer live as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their minds; they are darkened in their understanding, alienated from the life of God because of the ignorance that is in them, due to their hardness of heart; they have become callous and have given themselves up to licentiousness, greedy to practice every kind of uncleanness. You did not so learn Christ!—assuming that you have heard about him and were taught in him, as the truth is in Jesus. Put off your old nature which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful lusts, and be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and put on the new nature, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness. Therefore, putting away falsehood, let every one speak the truth with his neighbor, for we are members one of another.

According to St. John (6:24-35).

On the next day when the people who remained after the feeding of the five thousand saw that Jesus was not

there, nor his disciples, they themselves got into the boats and went to Caper'na-um, seeking Jesus. When they found him on the other side of the sea, they said to him, "Rabbi, when did you come here?" Jesus answered them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, you seek me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves. Do not labor for the food which perishes, but for the food which endures to eternal life, which the Son of man will give to you; for on him has God the Father set his seal." Then they said to him, "What must we do, to be doing the works of God?" Jesus answered them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent." So they said to him, "Then what sign do you do, that we may see, and believe you? What work do you perform? Our fathers ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written, 'He gave them bread from heaven to eat.'" Jesus then said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven; my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven, and gives life to the world." They said to him, "Lord, give us this bread always." Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; he who comes to me shall not hunger, and he who believes in me shall never thirst."
